Money Bingo

There are several ways to play this bingo game.

Supplies:

- Copy and laminate bingo cards on card stock or construction paper.
- Do you have a money spinner? You can easily make one by copying one bingo card to get coin pictures and then create your spinner. This could easily be used instead of a dice.
- OR Create a money dice (or buy one) Using a colored wooden block (1") affix coin stickers to all faces. Or hot glue plastic/real coins to the faces.

This game is played like traditional bingo.

Each player covers the FREE space.

After determining playing order the first student rolls the dice. A student rolls the dice and calls out the coin name and either heads or tails. ALL players cover that coin on their card. The next player rolls the dice and calls out the coin name and either heads or tails. All players cover that coin on their card.

If that coin is already covered, players wait for the next coin to be called.

Play continues with each player taking a turn to roll the dice and call the coins.

First player to have five in a row...calls Money...and is the winner.
